## SUPREME QUEEN’S OFFICIAL VISIT

What is the definition of etiquette? Etiquette can have different meanings and it can also be applied in different ways. We can certainly all identify what *not* to do when planning or attending a function of Nile, but often what we really need is a set of guidelines or rules of etiquette as to how to do this successfully.

The arrival of the Supreme Queen is very important. She has been invited to come and make her Official Visit at your Temple.

**Encourage punctuality** – when given a specific time of arrival for Her Supreme Majesty and always be there at an earlier time.

**Be prepared** – before she arrives. Be sure to have all arrangements in place so there won’t be any delays. This would include having her room setup properly. At her request, include complimentary snacks. For her convenience, have a room on the ground floor of the hotel. Make sure she can always stay connected with the membership by having a room with connections to the Internet. And, for an added touch, have a rose on her pillow.

**Meet and greet** – may be a tradition of your Temple, so have the appropriate people there to welcome her on her arrival.

In preparing for a Ceremonial there are many things you want to keep in mind:

**Wearing the appropriate attire** – for the occasion would encourage others to do the same.

**Mingle with all members** – and learn something new.

**Be discrete** – in your comments and report them to the Queen.

**Be polite and attentive** – while others are doing their part. Listen, listen, and you can hear the beautiful teachings of all lessons taught.

**Body language and facial expressions** – can give away your true feelings of things going on around you. Be careful of displaying what others may see.

**Turn off your cell phone** – and remember that silence is golden.

Use the rules of Etiquette to Excel in the success for your Temple and, above all, for yourself.
